

New Mexico Amateur Radio Volunteers have supported the Santa Fe Century for a number of years. The primary job of these volunteers is communications. Their mission is to:

- keep the tour management aware of race conditions
- relay management decisions
- monitor the welfare of those on the course
- <u>support</u> the New Mexico National Guard with locations and transport of participants requiring assistance.

The Amateur Radio Operators are both mobile over the 100 miles as well as stationary at the food/rest stops.

Their communications are possible through repeaters in the mountains north and south of the route. These privately owned facilities enable the central communications in Santa Fe to be relayed over the entire 100 mile length of the Santa Fe Century.
